*Inspiration*

Make a piece of art on a Post-It note and find a suitable place in the school to exhibit it.	Create a pen drawing using continuous line - not taking your pen off the paper.	Are you a lefty? Create a work of art with your right hand. Are you a righty? Create a work of art with your left hand.	Make a sculpture outside using found materials from that space, in an environmentally respectful way.	Start a drawing with one medium. Switch to another medium after 5 minutes. Switch to another medium in another 5 minutes.
"Look, Ma! No Hands!" Create a work of art without using your hands.	Create a drawing using 2 different drawing tools at the same time (e.g., HB and 6B; different coloured pens, etc. ).	Use a camera (or smartphone, tablet) to photograph the same subject from different points of view. Choose 1 to draw.	Have someone else draw you a random shape, and then complete the drawing.	Cut a figure out of a magazine, turn it upside down or sideways, and make it into something totally different.
Go for a short walk to photograph 5 random things. Choose one of them to draw or paint.	Go to <a href="http://artprompts.org">artprompts.org</a> and select a drawing prompt. Create your drawing.	Draw or paint something, then cut or tear it into pieces and rearrange them on a page.	Look out the window and create a work of art inspired by the weather.	Make art out of a medium you've never used before.
Get into an unusual position (e.g., lying on your back looking up) and make a work of art.	Create a work of art using unexpected materials.	Create a sculpture with your eyes closed (or blindfolded). Concentrate on your sense of touch.	Make art on atypical paper (map, paper napkin, newspaper, page out of a phone book, etc.)	Go outside and draw something you see.
Draw an animal 5 times, each time simplifying it until it turns into an abstract.	Find an image, turn it upside-down, and draw it.	Open a book to a random page, choose a word, and create a work of art inspired by that word.	Make a work of art out of torn paper.	Fill an entire page with doodles.

**Work your way through these ideas in whatever order you choose. Show your teacher when you have completed a horizontal, a vertical, a diagonal, an X, and a blackout.**
